

Local Bylaw GUYAH KEBLE

Introduction

The document is developed through the participatory processes giving regulatory power to the local community of GUYAH within the framework of the Ethiopian government. Local rules and regulations are defined in the document for all community members as well as visitors, increasing the accountability of the responsible bodies and individuals. The document can be updated according to the needs and discussions in the community.

Objective

The bylaw is the basis for sustainable use of local infrastructure and resources with clear rules and regulations

Stakeholder

The bylaw is applicable to residents of GUYAH as well as groups/communities who are in the GUYAH area. The regular elected members of the management committee consisting of the chairman, the vice chairman, a secretary and a cashier are from the community and represent the interest of the overall community which includes all social groups.

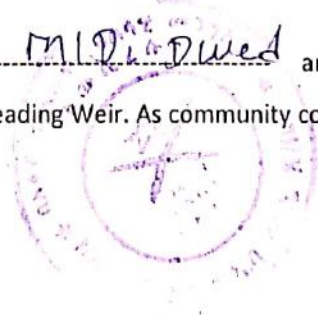

Beneficiaries of the bylaw are the residents of GUYAH as well as groups/communities who are in the GUYAH area.

Topics

Water Spreading Weir

ALI USMAN, MIDJED and OUSMA ALI are responsible for the topic Water Spreading Weir. As community contribution the community will support



the construction with one free labour day per week. Ali Usmati, Ali Usmati, Ali Usmati check regularly the construction. If there is a problem, it will be solved after heavy floods. Existing small damages get fixed by the community members. The responsible person is the focal person for the communication and the community budget for repairs.

Tree Protection Area

Yanti Galas, Ali Anis, and Husein Ali are responsible for the topic Tree Protection Area. The community agrees to protect all existing and newly planted trees in the area (see annex 1 map). Especially newly planted trees are particularly protected. The responsible person will organize the community to implement the protection plan according to the agreement and the map.

Fenced Area

Hamed Duli, Ali Usmati, Ali Usmati, Ali Usmati and Anel Kade are responsible for the topic Fenced Area. The fenced area can be e.g. agricultural areas, tree protection, vegetation protection, etc. Different types of fences are available and can be combined with mental fencing to further strengthen the protection. The fence is against wild and domestic animals. The responsible person will organize the community to implement the protection of the fenced areas.

Penalty

The community GUWATI agreed in the previous chapter of the agreement to follow several local regulations which need to be followed by the community members in the area. In case the local regulations are not followed, the community agrees to collect a penalty in case a person is not following the rules. Penalties are necessary if rules and regulations are not followed regularly. Penalties are:



Actions	First Time	Second Time	Third Time
No regular monitoring of WSW	Warning	500 ETB	500 ETB & 1 goats
No repair of damaged WSW is implemented in time	100 ETB	150 ETB	150 ETB & 1 goats
Cutting of a healthy tree	500 ETB	500 ETB & 1 goats	1500 ETB & 1 goat
No regular monitoring of fenced area	Warning	150 ETB	1500 ETB & 1 goat
Animals are within fenced area or animals are eating seedlings	Warning	300 ETB	1500 ETB & 1 goat

The penalties are reviewed regularly by the management committee and are changed according to experiences. Persons not following regulations have the option to explain themselves in front of the committee. Internal conflicts are solved on a local level whenever possible taking all stakeholders into consideration. At the end the management committee decides if local penalty need to be paid. The woreda administration will be involved if a conflict cannot get solved locally.

Collected penalty

The cashier from the management committee is responsible to collect penalties. All collected sanctions can only be used to reduce the effects of the broken regulation or for the overall benefit of the community. The planning committee discusses with the community the use of the penalties and identifies best possibility of spending the collected penalties.

Other local bylaws created by organized groups in GUVAH, like CBOs or collectives are harmonized, which will be reviewed on a yearly basis.
